There is no standard or even common interface for requesting more entries than the default for an RSS feed; Blogger and Wordpress have different ways of doing it. See <http://stackoverflow.com/questions/576552/how-do-i-fetch-all-old-items-on-an-rss-feed>.

Imposing a limit in general, though, is implemented by commit 201a2fe9f559dab1ff5fb3c97786471eb0bb75b9. If we want to add an interface for the end-user to change this limit, we can always do that later.
